Everyone is encouraged to attend and students are encouraged to bring supplies. Kindergarten Orientation will take place August 15 and 16 by appointment only.

**River Bend Middle School:** There will be a Sixth Grade Parent/Student meeting on Tuesday, August 16, 2022, from 6:00 P.M to 6:45 P.M. Seventh and Eighth Grade students can Drop and Go (supply drop off) from 7:00-7:30 P.M. the same evening.

**ZERO Day for ONLY FRESHMEN AND NEW HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS** will be from 8:05 A.M. until 10:30 A.M. on Tuesday, August 16, 2022.

**Ms. Shelby Wilkens and Mrs. Dawna Kurtz Fulton Blended Pre-school** begins August 17, 2022, AM class 9:00 - 11:30 A.M. and PM class 12:30 - 3:00 P.M. with school provided transportation.

## NOTICE TO NEW PUPILS

A pupil registering in a River Bend School for the first time after having attended school in another district should request the former school to send their grade and health records to the School they will attend this year. If this has not been done, the parent must sign a release and we will send a request for these records. New students are required to provide proof of residency within the District by providing the required number of documents from each of the following categories:

Most recent property tax bill and proof of payment, e.g., canceled check or Form 1098 (homeowners)

Letter of residence to be used when the person seeking to enroll a student is living with a District resident (7:60-AP2, E2)

#### REGISTRATION & FEE COLLECTION

River Bend Schools will again be utilizing a **two-step** online process to complete all student registration. Online registration will open July 5th and continue until August 12th. In order to complete the **two-step** 

online registration process, parents need to have a PowerSchool parent login and if wishing to pay applicable fees online, a PushCoin parent login. Fee payments in the form of cash or check may be paid at the District Office or at any of the school buildings during normal business hours. Registration is a TWO-STEP process! Information must be reviewed and updated in PowerSchool and then fees must be paid in PushCoin or by paying with cash or check at the District Office or one of the schools. Both steps must be completed for your student(s) registration to be considered complete.

Illinois law requires the school district to waive or reduce fees for children whose parents are unable to afford them, including but not limited to children receiving aid under Article IV of the Illinois Public Aid Code. Parents who feel that they cannot afford to pay full fees should contact the Principal to discuss their situation.

# PHYSICAL, DENTAL, & EYE EXAMINATIONS IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

In accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois, all students upon entrance into Pre-School, Kindergarten or school for the first time, Sixth and Ninth Grade must have a physical examination performed by a medical doctor. Chiropractor exams are **NOT** accepted. Physicals must be on an Illinois Department

of Health form and on file in the School where the student is in attendance. Forms are available in all School Offices and on the webpage.

State law and the Department of Public Health require evidence of immunity against:

Children entering Kindergarten are required to have a lead screen. A dental examination is also required for all students entering Kindergarten, Second, Sixth, and Ninth Grade. Students entering Kindergarten or an Illinois school for the first time are required to have an eye examination completed by an optometrist or physician who provides complete eye examinations.

Students in these grades must have the physical on file, or an appointment made by October 15th, or be suspended from School. Every effort should be made to have this completed by the first day of school. New students entering the District will have thirty (30) days to obtain such examinations or appointments after they are enrolled. STRICTLY ENFORCED, SO PLEASE DO IT NOW!

# Exemptions

In accordance with rules adopted by the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), a student will be exempted from this policy's requirements for:

- 1. Religious or medical grounds, if the student's parents/guardians present the IDPH's Certificate of Religious Exemption form to the Nurse. When a Certificate of Religious Exemption form is presented, the Nurse shall immediately inform the parents/guardians of exclusion procedures pursuant to Board policy 7:280, *Communicable and Chronic Infectious Disease* and State rules if there is an outbreak of one or more diseases from which the student is not protected.
- 2. Health examination or immunization requirements on medical grounds, if a physician provides written verification.
- 3. Eye examination requirement, if the student's parents/guardians show an undue burden or lack of access to a physician licensed to practice medicine in all of its branches who provides eye examinations or a licensed optometrist.
- 4. Dental examination requirement, if the student's parents/guardians show an undue burden or a lack of access to a dentist.

#### **ENTRANCE AGE**

A child must be five (5) years of age on or before September 1, 2022, to enroll in Kindergarten. A state certified birth certificate must be presented to School officials at the time of enrollment of a Kindergarten child. If a pupil is enrolling in the First Grade and did not attend Kindergarten, a state certified birth certificate must be presented. To be eligible to enter First Grade a student must have attained the age of six (6) years of age on or before September 1, 2022.

#### ANNUAL ASBESTOS MANAGEMENT PLAN NOTICE

This is to inform you of the status of River Bend CUSD #2 Asbestos Management Plan(s). It has been determined by the Illinois Department of Public Health and the Federal Environmental Protection Agency that asbestos is a potential health hazard and precautions should be taken to avoid disturbing any asbestos containing materials.

As required, our building(s) were initially inspected for asbestos on August 9, 1988. The AHERA law requires that a visual surveillance of asbestos containing areas be completed every six months, and a reinspection conducted every three years which was completed on September 15, 2021, and is due again by September 15, 2024. Any evidence of disturbance or change in condition will be documented in the Management Plan as required.

Please check listings below if you feel there is a possibility for one of these changes.

PLEASE DO NOT CALL THE SCHOOL ON MORNINGS WHEN THE WEATHER IS BAD. TO DO SO TIES UP THE PHONE LINES UNNECESSARILY. RIVER BEND SCHOOL DISTRICT MAY ADJUST SCHOOL TIMES OR DISMISS COMPLETELY AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Late starts are sometimes necessary due to heavy fog or icing conditions, making school bus and other vehicle travel extremely hazardous. Starting school later than usual will sometimes allow these conditions to improve.
- 2. Early dismissals are sometimes advisable because of hazardous weather conditions developing after school has started for the day.
- 3. Entire day dismissals are sometimes necessary because of severe weather conditions, such as heavy snow or ice and/or severe wind and cold temperatures, or a combination of these conditions.
