The Academy at Sauk Valley Community College - Dixon, Illinois - Seniors

The goal of The Academy at Sauk Valley Community College is to provide elite high school seniors access to an engaging college experience built upon academic excellence and leadership principles. Students who wish to enroll in The Academy should be highly motivated, have the ability to work independently without direct supervision, display self-discipline and demonstrate the desire to pursue college-level coursework beyond the high school curriculum. Student should also make sure they have reliable transportation for the duration of the program.

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DUAL ENROLLMENT (Cont.)

Clinton Community College (EICC) – Clinton, Iowa – Juniors – Seniors Four career academy disciplines are available to students at EICC at Clinton CC. **Education, Health, Small Business Management** and **Engineering Technology** curricula will put high school students on the fast track to careers. Students who take the classes at Clinton Community College's Career Academies earn both high school and college credits for the classes. Most of the CCC classes are early in the morning, students will miss only the first or first two class periods at the high school.

Community Involvement & Career Education – Juniors - Seniors

This class provides students with the opportunity to explore areas of interest while providing them the opportunity to offer service to the community. Students may use this opportunity to work with local businesses such as a mechanic, plumber, retail store owner, or a professional such as a dentist, chiropractor or nurse. Some may volunteer to tutor or assist at the elementary, middle, or high school. Students may assist almost anyone in the community as long as it is of a service nature and allows them the opportunity to learn about a possible job. Because this is a service to the community and a grade will be earned, no money may be received for the services.

Welding Internship - Juniors - Seniors

Students who have completed Welding I and II at Fulton High School will be able to enroll in an internship through EICC-Clinton and Clinton High School. Students will earn valuable on-the-job training at a local business while earning high school credit, as well as, being paid for their work. Students will continue to be enrolled in a normal school day with classes at FHS, take internship courses at Clinton High School and also be schedule to work during the school day.

Illinois Virtual High School (IVS) – 2nd semester Sophomores - Seniors

Full Service Courses are taught by Illinois licensed instructors responsible for maintaining communication with students, providing instructional feedback, and assisting with course content questions. Grades and Completion Certificates will be available to students, parents, and schools in the IVS Student Information System at the end of the semester or as students complete their course. \$240

<u>Credit Recovery Courses</u> are for Students Who Need to Retake a High School Course for Credit and Get Back on Track for Graduation. Credit Recovery Courses include prescriptive pretests to identify what a student has learned previously and areas of deficiency for each unit of content. An individual learning plan is automatically generated based on each unit pretest results. Students are not required to complete lessons and assessments for concepts they have mastered based on the pretest. \$95
