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- 9-11 **PRE-REGISTRATION FOR NEXT YEAR** will be conducted in February. Students need to start planning for next year's courses. Remember, required classes that are not passed this semester will have to be taken again next year. Talk to your teachers about class options and pre-requisites.
- 12 <u>SENIORS GET COLLEGE APPLICATIONS COMPLETED NOW!</u> Request electronic transcripts if possible (Parchment or SENDedu). Use "SENDedu and/or Common Application if possible for college applications.
- 12 <u>SENIORS COMPLETE YOUR FAFSA</u>. (FAFSA) can now be completed using last year's taxes. Get your FAFSA completed and submitted. Spend some time now researching financial aid, grants, loans and scholarships. Talk to your colleges of choice about financial aid. Only35 students have complete their forms That's only 48% of the senior class has filed their FAFSA so far.
 - To receive a diploma from a Fulton High School, the ISBE has stated that a student **must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**. If you have questions or need help please refer to my website <u>FHS Counselor's Corner</u> and click on the Financial Aid/FAFSA button. Alternatively, a parent/guardian must file a waiver if they choose to opt a child out of this graduation requirement by completing the Nonparticipation form; students who are at least 18 years of age or legally emancipated may complete the form themselves. If you wish to opt yourself or your student out of the Financial Aid Application graduation requirement, please complete the attached form and return it to me by email or drop it off at the Student Services office.
