- SENIORS-OCTOBER IS FINANCIAL AID MONTH You need to complete your FSA ID and FAFSA NOW!

 FAFSA THE FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID is now a required step for students to earn a diploma from an Illinois High School. For more information, go to the Financial Aid/FAFSA tab under FHS Counselor's Corner on the district website. Students and parents need to start by creating a FSA ID by going to https://fsaid.ed.gov/npas/index.htm
- FAFSA COMPLETION WORKSHOP is scheduled for Thursday, October 14 at 5:30 pm at Fulton High School in the Library. Jennifer Schultz, Director of Financial Assistance at SVCC, will help students and parents with filling out their FAFSA. 1 parent and the student should have completed a FSA ID prior to this workshop. This will allow for the FAFSA to be submitted that night. Please bring the following; Social Security Number, Records of income for 2020 (see below), such as income earned from work and business, child support paid or received and any other untaxed income. If you have them, refer to the W-2 Forms or Federal Income Tax Return IRS 1040, 1040A or 1040EZ, Information about assets, such as savings, certificates of deposit, stock options, bonds, 529 plans and other college savings programs; and investment real estate, business and farm, Driver's license number, if you have one, Dates of birth, include the month, day and year. Month and year of marriage, separation, divorce or other change in marital status, Alien Registration Number, if your student is not a U.S. citizen.
 - *Applying is easier with the IRS Data Retrieval Tool! Students and parents who have filed their 2020 federal tax return may be able to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool to easily, accurately and securely transfer their tax information into the FAFSA form.
- SENIORS GET EARLY COLLEGE APLLICATIONS COMPLETED NOW!! Request electronic transcripts if possible (Parchment or SENDedu). Use "SENDedu" and/or "Common Application" if possible for college applications. If you have not done so, set up your parchment account. If you already have one, great, if not you have gotten an invitation in your email inviting you to set up your account please contact Mr. Baisden or Ms. Griser. All applications should be done by the end of **November**. Only 2 months to get them done!
- 11-12 <u>US SENATE YOUTH PROGRAM</u> is available for junior and senior students who are currently serving in an elected capacity in student government with the intention to take government courses in college. Two students from the state of Illinois will be selected to experience U.S. government in Washington D.C. Applications are due by <u>October 8</u>. - 11-12 SVCC Dual Credit students are able to apply of scholarships to help pay for their credits. Students should check the svcc.edu web site on the <u>first of each month</u> to apply for scholarship help. They are also encouraged to apply for scholarships for 2nd semester classes. Those applications become available in October. When asked for a filed FAFSA, attach a word document that states that you are a Dual Credit Student and have not filed yet.
- 11-12 <u>ACT REGISTRATION</u> for the December 11 test date must be completed by November 5. School code is 141980. Register on-line at www.act.org.
- 11-12 <u>SAT REGISTRATION</u> for the November 6 test date must be completed by October 8. School code is 141980. Register on-line at www.sat.org/register. Next date: December 4, register by November 4.
- 11-12 ARE YOU AN 18 YEARS OLD MALE? If you are you must register with selective service. You can register as early as 17 years and 3 months old. You are required by law to register. By doing so you will be eligible for student loans and grants, job training and government jobs as well as avoiding a 5-year prison sentence and up to \$250,000 fine. Register at the post-office, drivers licensing facility, or on line at https://www.sss.gov/. Another way a young man can register is to check a box on the application form for federal student financial aid (FAFSA). Check "Register Me" on Box #22 of that form, and the Department of Education will furnish Selective Service with the information to register you.
- 9-12 XELLO CAREER EXPLORATION Not sure what career you want to pursue? Hit the XELLO button on "Counselor's Corner". Here you can explore your own personal career options. Using your own interests, personality type and learning style this program will help you explore careers that match your wants and needs. It will help you decide what type of training you will need whether it is "On the Job Training" or Post-High School education in a college of some sort. With this program, you get to be in the driver's seat.
