12 <u>SENIORS – COMPLETE YOUR FAFSA</u>. (FAFSA) can now be completed using your 2020 taxes. Get your FAFSA completed and submitted. Spend some time now researching financial aid, grants, loans and scholarships. Talk to your colleges of choice about financial aid. Only 34 students have completed their forms – That's only 53% of the senior class that has filed their FAFSA so far. Priority for programs with limited funds is often given to students filing the FAFSA as soon as possible.

FAFSA – THE FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID is a **required step for students to earn** <u>a diploma</u> from an Illinois High School. For more information, go to the Financial Aid/FAFSA tab under FHS Counselor's Corner on the district website. **Students and parents need to start by creating a FSA ID** by going to <u>https://fsaid.ed.gov/npas/index.htm</u>

- 12 <u>SENIORS GET COLLEGE APPLICATIONS COMPLETED NOW!</u> Request electronic transcripts if possible (Parchment or SENDedu). Use "SENDedu and/or "Common Application" if possible for college applications.
- 11-12 **SVCC Dual Credit Scholarships** are available to students to help pay for their credits. Students should check the svcc.edu web site on the **first of each month** to apply for scholarship help. When asked for a filed FAFSA, if you have not yet filed, attach a word document that states that you are a Dual Credit Student and have not filed yet.
- 9-12 <u>SCHOLARSHIPS</u> are being updated weekly. Check out our school website each week to see what scholarship applications deadlines are coming up. Scholarships are listed in 3 categories; River Bend-Area/Regional-National. In addition, you will have the opportunity to develop a lasting and important network of contacts. The class meets for 1.5 hours each school day (7:50-9:20) and you can plan on spending time outside of the school day following through with the work and projects of the class. Remember, required classes that are not passed 1st and/or 2nd semester will have to be taken again next year. Talk to your teachers about class options and pre-requisites.

 - 3. Late Feb-Early March Teachers Recommendations for all students 8th grade 11th grade.
 - 4. <u>Middle of March</u> Registration by class 8^{th} grade 11^{th} grade.
 - 5. Late March-Early April Student requests tabulated and Master Schedule parameters set for scheduling.

- 11-12 <u>ARE YOU AN 18 YEARS OLD MALE?</u> If you are you must register with selective service. You can register as early as 17 years and 3 months old. You are required by law to register. By doing so you will be eligible for student loans and grants, job training and government jobs as well as avoiding a 5-year prison sentence and up to \$250,000 fine. Register at the post-office, drivers licensing facility, or on line at <u>https://www.sss.gov/. Another way a young man can register is to check a box on the application form for federal student financial aid (FAFSA). Check "Register Me" on Box #22 of that form, and the Department of Education will furnish Selective Service with the information to register you.</u>
- 11-12 SAT REGISTRATION Students who would like to take or retake a College Entrance Exam the next test date for the SAT is March 12. Registration materials must be completed by February 11. School code is 141980. Register on-line at www.sat.org/register . ALL Fulton High School Juniors will be taking the SAT in April. The fee is paid for by the State of Illinois.
