GET EARLY COLLEGE APLLICATIONS COMPLETED NOW!! Request electronic transcripts if Possible through Parchment. Use "Parchment" and/or "Common Application" if possible for college applications. All applications should be done by November. Only 2 months to get them done!

FAFSA – THE FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID is now a required step for students to earn a diploma from an Illinois High School. FHS will be having a workshop later this semester to help parents with filling out the form. For more information, go to the Financial Aid/FAFSA tab under FHS Counselor's Corner on the district website. Students and parents can get started by creating a FSA ID by going to <a href="https://fsaid.ed.gov/npas/index.htm">https://fsaid.ed.gov/npas/index.htm</a> This year's FAFSA application will be available on October 1.

<u>GET YOUR INOCULATION/SHOT RECORDS UP TO DATE</u>. Check with your physician, health department and/or FHS to make sure you have all shot records in ONE location and ready to deliver to the college of your choice.

- PSAT/NMSQT TESTING will be on Thursday morning, October 12 at 8:00 am at FHS. This is a pre-SAT assessment that will help ALL Junior students prepare for the SAT they will be taking in April. Also, students who are planning on taking any AP courses such as English, AP Statistics and/or Calculus will see if those courses are a good match for their senior year schedule.
- ASVAB will be given to <u>ALL JUNIORS</u> on Wednesday, <u>October 26 at 8:15 AM 11:30 AM</u>. The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery will be administered at the high school. The most important feature of this test is that it can help students find out what occupations may be a good fit for them. Plus, the results can be used if they are interested in serving in the military.
- EXPLORE SAUK is an opportunity to visit the campus and talk to current students. - 11-12 <u>ACT REGISTRATION</u> for the October 22 test date must be completed by September 16. School code is 141980. Register on-line at www.act.org.
- 11-12 **SAT REGISTRATION** for the November 5 test date must be completed by October 7. School code is 141980. Register on-line at www.sat.org/register.
- 11-12 ARE YOU AN 18 YEARS OLD MALE? If you are you must register with selective service. You can register as early as 17 years and 3 months old. You are required by law to register. By doing so you will be eligible for student loans and grants, job training and government jobs as well as avoiding a 5-year prison sentence and up to \$250,000 fine. Register at the post-office, drivers licensing facility, or on line at <a href="https://www.sss.gov/">https://www.sss.gov/</a>. Another way a young man can register is to check a box on the application form for federal student financial aid (FAFSA). Check "Register Me" on Box #22 of that form, and the Department of Education will furnish Selective Service with the information to register you.
