GET EARLY COLLEGE APLLICATIONS COMPLETED NOW!! Request electronic transcripts if Possible through Parchment. Use "Parchment", "Common Application" and/or the College Board's "Big Future" if possible for college applications. All applications should be done by November.

FAFSA – THE FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID is now a required step for students to earn a diploma from an Illinois High School. FHS will be having a FAFSA completion workshop early in the 2nd semester to help parents with filling out the form. For more information, go to the Financial Aid/FAFSA tab under FHS Counselor's Corner on the district website.

<u>GET YOUR INOCULATION/SHOT RECORDS UP TO DATE</u>. Check with your physician, health department and/or FHS to make sure you have all shot records in ONE location and ready to deliver to the college of your choice.

- 11-12 ALL AP STUDENTS will need to register and pay exam fees by November 10 for the May test date.
- 11-12 2nd SEMESTER DUAL CREDIT STUDENTS. Both CCC and SVCC registration for Spring term opens
 October 30 and November 6 respectively. If you have SVCC dual credit classes on your schedule for the second semester, you have to enroll online. CCC registration requires a paper registration (from Mr. Baisden). Some of the seats are starting to be populated by other students in the area. Make sure you are following the guidelines listed in the Counselor's corner website. Some of you have gone in and registered as a traditional college student and you cannot enroll that way. You are a Dual Credit Student. Do not wait, you may lose your seat if the course(s) fill up. Make sure you let Mr. Baisden know what class(es) you have enrolled in.
- 11-12 SVCC Dual Credit students are able to apply for scholarships to help pay for their credits. Students should check the svcc.edu web site on the <u>first of each month</u> to apply for scholarship help. They are also encouraged to apply for scholarships for 2nd semester classes. Those applications become available in October. When asked for a filed FAFSA, attach a word document that states that you are a Dual Credit Student and have not filed yet.
- 10-12 <u>SENIORS, JUNIORS AND SOPHOMORES</u> Open up your College Board account and retrieve your SAT, PSAT 10 or PSAT 8/9 scores. If you are having trouble getting into your College Board account call this number for customer service 866-756-7346 they are very helpful and easy to talk to.
- 9-12 <u>SCHOLARSHIP UP-DATE</u> The following scholarships are found on the school's web-site and are due within the next few weeks. Go to Fulton High School-FHS Counselor's Corner-Scholarships. Try <u>www.scholarships.com</u> to help you with scholarship searches.

- OUR UNITED STATES MILITARY ACADEMYS OFFER SUMMER SEMINARS. - 11-12 ARE YOU AN 18 YEARS OLD MALE? If you are you must register with selective service. You can register as early as 17 years and 3 months old. You are required by law to register. By doing so you will be eligible for student loans and grants, job training and government jobs as well as avoiding a 5-year prison sentence and up to \$250,000 fine.
