<u>GET EARLY COLLEGE APLLICATIONS COMPLETED NOW!!</u> Request electronic transcripts if Possible through **Parchment**. Use "**Parchment**" and/or "**Common Application**" if possible for college applications. All applications should be done by November. Only 2 months to get them done!

<u>FAFSA – THE FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID</u> is now a <u>required step for</u> <u>students to earn a diploma</u> from an Illinois High School. FHS will be having a workshop later this semester to help parents with filling out the form. For more information, go to the Financial Aid/FAFSA tab under FHS Counselor's Corner on the district website. Students and parents can <u>get started</u> by creating a FSA ID by going to <u>https://fsaid.ed.gov/npas/index.htm</u> This year's FAFSA application will be available around <u>mid-December</u>.

<u>GET YOUR INOCULATION/SHOT RECORDS UP TO DATE</u>. Check with your physician, health department and/or FHS to make sure you have all shot records in ONE location and ready to deliver to the college of your choice.

Plus, the results can be used if they are interested in serving in the military.

- 11-12 <u>ARE YOU AN 18 YEARS OLD MALE?</u> If you are you must register with selective service. You can register as early as 17 years and 3 months old. You are required by law to register. By doing so you will be eligible for student loans and grants, job training and government jobs as well as avoiding a 5-year prison sentence and up to \$250,000 fine. Register at the post-office, drivers licensing facility, or on line at <u>https://www.sss.gov/</u>.
- 9-12 <u>XELLO CAREER EXPLORATION</u> Not sure what career you want to pursue? Hit the XELLO button on "Counselor's Corner". Here you can explore your own personal career options. Using your own interests, personality type and learning style this program will help you explore careers that match your wants and needs.
